Recap of Last Month's Meeting

Tina Guard, P.E. LEED AP from Balzhiser Hubbard Engineers did a presentation on U of O Matthew Knight Arena. Tina is a Civil Engineer and has worked at Balzhiser Hubbard for 8 years. There were originally 20 sites that were looked at for the new arena and it was narrowed down to 7- Franklin 1 &3, North Campus, Howe Field, Autzen Stadium, and the Federal Courthouse. Originally Howe Field was chosen in 2003, but due to all the protests Williams' Bakery was then chosen. Williams' Bakery is 6.5 acres and has a good location, but there were a lot of right-of-way acquisition issues. The U of O acquired the adjacent properties before even applying for the permits to reduce the right-of-way acquisition issues.

There are many companies working on this project; National Championship Properties (NCP) (non-profit group including Phil Knight, Hoffman, Fortis, UO, JMIS , Ellerbe Becket, TVA, Walker Macy and Balzhiser Hubbard. Hoffman is constructing the parking garage and the arena, Fortis the Alumni Center, and Balzhiser Hubbard is did the surveying and is doing the public improvements part of the project. They are also pursuing "LEED" gold.

In July 2007, a \$200 million bond was secured. In August 2007, Phil & Penny Knight donated \$100 million which is slated to support the operation costs of the arena, as there will not be adequate self-supporting profit for several years. The new arena will have 12,500 seating capacity and provides expansion for more seating up to 15,000. In February of 2008, the parking garage was added due to the concerns of noise, traffic and parking shortage by the Fairmount Neighborhood Association. The parking garage will provide approximately 375 spaces at a cost of \$30,000 go \$35,000 per space. Yikes! But the neighborhood was happy! There will be public transportation shuttle provided by LTD just like it does for the U of O football games at Autzen.

One of the major project challenges is that there are so many tiers of approval. The civil site construction has not even started yet. There have been tons of RFIs and no one anticipated how intense this project would be. The civil challenges were many including rerouting the public utilities and the drainage problems that occurred because the parking garage is so shallow. The Arena event level is 25 – 30 ft. below ground surface. Originally, the arena was scheduled to be completed in 26 months and be ready for the 2010 basketball season, but due to the delay of the "Conditional Use Permit" they are scheduled to be completed by December 2010, and in time for the PAC-10 basketball season.

Some interesting facts are that the support structure of the parking garage had to be re-designed due to the added load of the Alumni Center. Also, there is \$5 million slated for alternates due to the low bids on many aspects of this project because of the economy. For example, the boom cranes which usually rent for \$33,000 per month were rented at \$13,000 per month for this project.

Thanks so much to Tina Guard for coming to speak to us and Janet Spriggs for helping out. It was a very informative and interesting presentation.
