It's renewal time!

NAWIC's fiscal year is almost over; it ends Sept. 30. This means it's time to renew your membership. Members with an e-mail address listed in the NAWIC Database have been e-mailed a link to renew online (a paper invoice will not be mailed). Members who do not have an email address on file or who indicated they preferred regular mail have been sent a renewal in the mail.

Printed invoices can be downloaded from the NAWIC Web site. Go to www.nawic.org > Member Sign In > Pay Dues-Dues Renewal. Select your membership type; verify or change your contact information; select "check" as form of payment; select "same as personal address;" click "submit." A link to your invoice will be sent to your e-mail address. If you chose check as form of payment, your renewal will not be complete until we receive your payment. To expedite the renewal process, please include a copy of the invoice with your payment. Renewals are processed by the date payment is received. To decrease the processing time of your renewal, we strongly recommend that you renew online. NAWIC accepts American Express, Discover, MasterCard and Visa, so renewing online is easy.

If your e-mail address changes, please be sure to update your information by visiting www.nawic.org > Member Sign In > Member Center > Update Your Info.

Renewals must be received (not postmarked) by the NAWIC Office by Oct. 1, 2011. Beginning Oct. 2, a \$25 late fee will be assessed. There will be no exceptions.

Reminder: New members who joined between November 2010 and September 2011 will receive a renewal statement, but their national dues will be prorated.

NAWIC/CSI 2011 Golf Tournament sponsor pitch sheet

Tournament Sponsor - \$800

Total of (1) Sponsor

This is the primary sponsorship for the event. Sponsor Company can set up a booth or hang a banner behind the podium at the tournament pavilion, company logos will be displayed on all the tournament advertising material, company will be acknowledged during the post-game program.

Awards Sponsors - \$600

Total of (1) Sponsor

Sponsor Company can hang a banner at the tournament pavilion and will be acknowledged in the post-game program.

Team Bag Sponsor - \$500

Total of (1) Sponsor

Sponsor Company can place marketing materials in the team bags (which include 4 sleeves of balls, tees, markers, and promotional materials. For an additional \$300, Sponsor can place their logo on the ball with the NAWIC/CSI logo.

Win A Car Hole Sponsor - \$500

Sponsor Company can place a vehicle + advertising materials at the hole. Sponsor will be acknowledged during post-game program. Challenge Package for golfers

Golfers can purchase the Challenge Package at registration for \$10. This will enter them in all the Special Events contests.

Pre Game Contest:

Speed Putting Contest – This pre-game activity will take place on the large putting green next to the clubhouse. Golfers can buy a chance to putt for \$1. There will be 10 balls placed on markers, golfers will have 10 seconds to putt as many as they can. Most sunk putts wins ½ the pot. Ties result in a bonus tie breaker round.
