Recap of Last Month's Meeting

Mike Kuvaas, Special Projects Coordinator, at AFLAC was our January speaker. Mike worked at Bi-Mart for 20 years in management and 5 years in sales at a distributor for beer and wine. He started at AFLAC training and hiring new employees. AFLAC has been around for 55 years and came out of a need to help pay the bills that medical insurance did not cover. Originally AFLAC started out selling cancer insurance, but over the years has expanded to include many other situations and mainstream benefit options.

Mike's presentation was not to sell insurance, but to get the word out to employers the benefits that are available to help their employees. AFLAC has been listed the "Most Ethical Insurance Company in American" for the last 5 years. It is there to strengthen the benefit packages of companies at little to or no cost to the employer. It gives the employees the ability to directly receive and manage benefits checks and provides potential tax savings when made available under a cafeteria plan and helps prevent overwhelming medical debt.

AFLAC has 10 different products which service companies as well as individuals. In the event of serious illness or injury AFLAC can help. They can bridge your medical plan with Accident Indemnity and Hospital Indemnity which provide cash directly to you to help with co-pays, deductibles, and personal expenses. You can spend these monies on anything and they are paid directly to you. Claims processing takes an average of 4 days. Your agent is there to help you and you deal directly with him.

Short-term Disability is also available to protect your paycheck if you are unable to work due to illness or injury. They guarantee up to 60% of gross income, with a maximum of \$3000 per month, regardless of pre-existing health conditions.

AFLAC can also provide funds in the event of catastrophic health events. Their Cancer, Intensive Care, Critical Illness and Life Insurance pay benefits to you in the event of catastrophic illness or injury. Dental plans are also available, as primary or supplemental coverage.

One question asked was how they came up with the duck as their mascot. Mike said that one of the board members said that every time he heard the word AFLAC it sounded like a duck quacking.
